

# 2014 Evacuation Zone Identification Survey

FLASH conducted an online and telephone survey of emergency managers in 222 coastal cities, counties, parishes, and regions from Texas to Maine to compile available resources on local evacuation zones and storm surge mapping for consumers.

## Findings

152 (68.7%) of the 222 local coastal communities have evacuation zone maps available online.
